The ECOLNET project is a 3-year European project, running from 2010 to 2013, cofunded by the E.C. through the Lifelong Learning Programme. It is implemented in 10 EU countries and involves 11 organisations.

The European Ecotourism Network (EEN) is a network of organisations that aims to ensure that ecotourism offerings in Europe are part of a genuine conservation and sustainability effort. EEN supports the development and implementation of the European Ecotourism Labeling Standard (EETLS), a product of a previous Leonardo da Vinci project, ECO-DESTINET, refined and updated by ECOLNET.

Ecotourism in Spain: Sustainability, Cooperation and Innovation

TUREBE, a group focused on the technological and sustainable development of Spanish Ecotourism Destinations and businesses, presented the "Ecotourism in Spain" Club at FITUR 2013 (International Tourism Trade Fair of Madrid). The "Ecotourism in Spain" Club is a unique tourism product in that it is being developed in Protected Areas accredited with quality and sustainability systems, which allows for the enjoyment of the best of Spanish nature while contributing to its conservation.

The "Ecotourism in Spain" Club is conceived by Tourspain -a body of the Ministry of Industry, Energy and Tourismas a certified quality supplier of tourism for Spanish protected areas (National Parks, Natural Reserves, Biosphere Reserves, Geoparks, Natura 2000 Sites). These are destinations that are committed to sustainable tourism through systems like ECST (European Charter for Sustainable Tourism), the Spanish Biosphere Reserves Product Club, or Geoparks Product Club, which have tourism service suppliers also committed to improving the sustainability of their business with a three year Improvement Plan. At present, over 600 tourism businesses are adhered to one of these systems and therefore to the "Ecotourism in Spain" Club.



TUREBE is an Innovative Business Group, comprising of a group of private or public companies, institutions and business associations, linked to the ecotourism sector, which strive to collaborate in a series of initiatives designed to promote innovation. TUREBE was created to provide innovative, collaborative and sustainable solutions for Protected Areas and ecotourism business of these areas. The next assembly of TUREBE will take place in April 2013 where they will decide

whether they will take the necessary steps to be the manager of the "Ecotourism in Spain" Club.

TUREBE has developed several innovative Marine Stewardship projects: Biodiversity; Interactive Routes Reserves; Biosphere Landscape Interpretation, Environment Information & Guides through augmented reality technology and geolocation (I-Cairn). They are currently developing a pilot project called "Ecotourism Payback Experience" that aims to design a new and attractive system for responsible tourists to enjoy an exclusive ecotourism experience, through the visit of fascinating nature conservation actions. The project will define the "payback" system so that visitors and tourism businesses can contribute to biodiversity conservation the destination. This system is also used to increase the customers' interest and loyalty. Connecting Past & Future in Olympos/ Antalya

On 26th September 2012 the German – Turkish Organisation RTM ("Responsible Tourism Management") organized a international conference on sustainable tourism and ecotourism entitled "Connecting Past & Future" in Olympos/ Antalya. About 60 decision makers and tourism stakeholders from the local, regional and national level discussed with international experts the opportunities to make their hotels and travel packages more sustainable and how to use the rich nature, culture and host population for innovation.



Herbert Hamele/ECOTRANS presented the European Ecotourism Labelling Standard (EETLS) as state-of-the-art guidelines for decision makers. As a tangible result the participants agreed to use the European Ecotourism Labelling Standard and the related e-tool to assess the sustainability level of their tourism businesses. The assessment results shall be considered in the development of an action programme for sustainable tourism development in the region.

The theme of the Conference is *Destinations and Labelling for Ecotourism Development in Europe*, offering a unique opportunity to get in touch with professionals and stakeholders from a variety of sectors in ecotourism, across the continent and beyond. The objective of the conference is to foster and develop cooperation and the exchange of knowledge and best practices, for responsible practitioners and ecotourism developers in order to address the following topics:

- A. Can the concept of ecotourism in Europe be translated into commonly agreed standards based on the European Ecotourism Labelling Standard (EETLS)?
- B. Is the concept of ecotourism destination commonly understood and agreed upon by the ecotourism developers and protected area networks in Europe as one of the main tools for nature conservation and regional sustainable development?
- C. Can the concept of ecotourism destinations attract the interest of the main ecotourism and protected area promoters in Europe in order to better communicate with the general public and potential tourists?



For a period of two days, the participants will be involved in debates and fruitful discussions regarding the current understanding and future development of new ecotourism initiatives in Europe.

For a further day, the participants will also have the opportunity to experience some of the most inspiring ecotourism offers in the Romanian Carpathians: searching for wolves, bears and lynx tracks in the Carpathian forests, hiking or biking along the trails crossing some of the most exciting high nature value landscapes of Europe, discovering proof of the long

history of Transylvania's multi-ethnical culture, and much more....

Ecolnet Project's 2nd International Workshop was held in Tartu, Estonia on 29th June 2012. The Workshop had an international character, since it was broadcast live via the internet. The workshop was attended by the Ecolnet partners, the participants of 11th Summer Academy of Euracademy Association, nature based tourism students of Estonian University of Life Sciences, Estonian ecotourism providers and other stakeholders.

During the morning session, the participants discussed the implementation of the Project, the European Ecotourism Labeling Standard (EETLS), the structure of the online E-Learning Packages and the

role of the sustainable tourism Portal destinet.eu .



During the afternoon session, the floor was given to Estonian Ecotourism stakeholders. "Estonia - the Natural Way" a national quality standard, Soomaa a member of PAN Parks, bird waching activities, tourism E-marketing and the connection between social media and tourism in protected areas were presented and discussed.



After the official part of the workshop was over, the group of participants had a trip on an Estonian barge along the Emajögi (Mother river) to downtown Tartu. During that lovely evening we feltd that everything is possible through teamwork - even playing Vivaldi Four seasons on zither in ensemble after 5 minutes of training!

Piloting the E-tools and E-Learning Packages
