We would like to inform you of the creation of the **European Ecotourism Network** by leading organisations on the theme in Europe, which is co-funded by the European Commission for the next three years by the ECOLNET project, a follow up to the successful Eco-Destinet and Eco-Route E.C co-funded projects.

The European Ecotourism Network (heritage/ecotourism/european-ecotourism-network) is building an on-line community that will:

- 1. Connect ecotourism stakeholders for knowledge transfer purposes
- 2. Promote the further development and implementation of a common European Standard for ecotourism
- 3. Develop e-learning and evaluation systems for agencies, companies and evaluators in application of the European Ecotourism Labelling Standard (EETLS see below)

Our common purpose is to ensure that ecotourism offerings can be part of a genuine conservation and sustainability effort.
