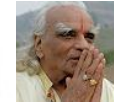

OLYMPIC TRUCE MATERIAL

You are here because the Olympic Games has traditionally been used as a means of preventing conflict and creating peace between nations at war, and the International Olympic Committee (IOC) and United Nations (UN) have transposed this ancient peace ethic to the modern Games. Links are given here to the [strategic document](#) behind this training event, which will inform you of the UN Truce resolution and the build up to London 2012. You will also find the information on the [London 2012 Olympic Peace Campaign](#), with current [comment and analysis of the London 2012 Truce situation](#). This material should be the basis of learning how the Truce implementation process is managed in your country. This will then enable you to begin to see ways of raising the profile and activities for the next Olympic Truce, in Brazil 2016.

- c) Can you identify organisations who are responsible for this, and those who have an active interest in promoting the Truce.

UNESCO YOUTH PEACE AMBASSADORS TRAINING PROGRAMME

On the first Monday the whole day will be dedicated to this, and on subsequent days you will have time to work with others on your own peace planning processes guided by the UNESCO staff team and other participants experiences. Before coming to the UK please edit on your profile form to update and clarify what you have answered (initial responses from some participants are below). Please send Gordon (gordon.sillence@gmail.com) the updates before you leave. All profile forms received so far are attached so you may get to read about your peers to read their stories.

Preparing 5 minute stories

When you get here you should have prepared the following initial short presentations (5 minutes including either Word or power point)

- Self presentation to the group (verbal)
- Your country situation (e.g. up to 6 ppt slides)
- Peace making dreams (word or ppt)
- Your One Minute Olympic Truce Presentation– see above (verbal/ppt)
- A surf session of 10 internet sites, videos, etc, you like that portray the fight against violence (url list)

Your chosen individual action project theme

During the training you will be asked to work on developing your own peace projects, as action plans under the UNESCO YPA programme. In addition to time outside the sessions, there are 3 sessions set aside (Tues 3rd all afternoon and Wed 4th all morning and a final Friday session) to work on these plans individually and collectively, during which you will have to make a short formal presentation of the work you would like to develop. This could be something you are already involved in, and we will teach evaluation skills, and other points.

Team work activities

You will also contribute to the following collective activities.

- Making an event video record
- Chant for peace
- A war and peace internet tour
- Peace through tourism using sport and cultural exchange
- Inner peace practice
- Other initiatives you work together on with the other trainees.

Making an event film/video record

If you have video filming and processing skills, reporting, interviewing and presentation skills, then you can volunteer to join a group who will be responsible for filming this event. There is an excellent Nigerian Peace Workshop Training video example with great messages at <http://traubman.igc.org/vidnigeria.htm>. Please let Gordon know if you would like to join this group.

Chant for peace

If you have a musical voice or talent you might want to get together and make up a global chant for peace - short, simple, repeatable, inspirational! – we could use it at the Olympic Truce Workshop End and Closing Ceremony. We hope to make a youtube video of the whole group performing this.

A war and peace internet tour

From the internet sites you have collected at home, a group of you can choose a war and peace tour of the internet.

Creating a peace through tourism programme using sport and cultural exchange for your country

The peace through tourism component is a bigger collective task where we will be asking you to:

- a) make up a visitors' tour package in your own country to show travellers a good way to see your cultural inheritance and innovations in a responsible and interesting way.
- b) assess how sports and culture tourism can help bring peace and an economic stimulus to your country or region.

You will get to learn about and use the [DestiNet Sustainable & Responsible Tourism Portal](#) to set up and run a collective on-line office space for post project networking, and to give you the opportunity to network your country's peace through tourism processes and the potential to commercialize sustainable and responsible tourism in your region.

Inner Peace Practice

Lasting peace is upheld by a personal value system each one of us must cultivate. Working on inner peace practice is as essential as working for community, national or global peace. Over the course of the daily workshops you will have the opportunity to learn profound inner peace techniques that blend NLP, Yoga and Martial Arts to keep you centred, balanced, focused and calm, and let you pass those qualities on by example and instruction. We also welcome sharing of your experiences and methods for peace.

- Planning Olympic Truce Activities for Brazil 2016
- Rio+20 follow up actions – strengthening the global youth voice

Programme Follow -up

21st September International Peace Day - Online check on youth peace ambassadors return status and kick-off of online global youth peace ambassadors support community.

The youths will join in UNESCO's Youth Peace Ambassador Network (see www.unescobkk.org/rushsap) and be supported to develop peace and reconciliation programmes in their own countries, including the further implementation of the next Olympic Truce for Brazil 2016.

Each workshop will include all participants along with facilitators with assistant for session documentation: We will add some further keynote speakers, invited panellists, youth peace ambassador (YPA) program participants, other youth invitees from the U.K. and abroad paired to YPAs, and programme stewards. Workshops will also include comments and debate with participation of all. Some proceedings will be recorded on video (with those participants who consent to the film, and process being shown). Learning outcomes of each workshop will be compiled into a manual for peace for participants at the end of the programme. The event will be hosted by the **Sri Guru Singh Sabha Gurdwara in Southall**, London UK, with the event training taking place in the Norwood Hall, Norwood Green Road, Southall, Middlesex, UB2 4LA, UK . The venue contact number is 02085716888.

Travel: Heathrow is the ideal airport to land at. We will arrange to meet at a specific location that will be confirmed to each of you, currently at the airport arrivals exit. Do have some local currency changed when you arrive. Taxi costs will not be reimbursed.

Accommodation: has been arranged at [Stay City Apartments](#), which is conveniently located for arrival at Heathrow and a short commute (one train stop) to Southhall.

Food: will be provided by the Gurdwara for the sessions there. This will be Indian vegetarian food. For meal times at the Gurdwara you will be asked to remove your shoes and cover your head, so please be prepared for this. Please inform the coordinator of other special dietary requirements you may have. The apartments

have cooking facilities if you wish to prepare your own food, and we will also consider other options after we get together with you all.

Financial Arrangements

Some of you will have received subsidies to attend this event. For those of you who need to pay the £500 participation fee that covers accommodation, food and travel around London, please either bring this with you in UK Pounds to pay on registration, or make a bank transfer (please contact Gordon Sillence for details) up to five working days before the 31st August. Take out your own medical and travel insurance please. All of you will need money for your own food and drinks on excursion days (see below).

Social Programme

The full programme will be given on arrival. Currently there are 3 group excursions planned for Sunday 1st Saturday 8 and Sunday 9th. On the final Sunday we will gather in Trafalgar Sq for the closing ceremony celebrations.

What to pack

Please provide a short biography (100 words)	I was born in 1994, in Jaghori, Ghazni. I first started attending school in Jaghori, in 2001, after the fall of the Taliban in a primary school. I studied until my fifth grade in there. In 2005 our family moved to Kabul and I joined Marefat High School. I have been studying at Marefat High School since then. I am currently studying 12 th grade. I am the director of Marefat English Language Program too.
What language(s) do you speak?	I speak Dari, Pashtu and English.
Would you need assistance with English translation?	No. I don't need any assistance with English translation.
Have you been involved with any peace initiatives before?	I attended a ten days workshop named "Youth Ambassador for Peace" some two years ago. I got a certificate from the workshop. I helped in organizing a ceremony for international peace day in which Captain Renee Marie gifted Marefat High School a "peace pole".

Please write a comment about the information you're your perspective (maximum ½ page).</p>	<p>According to the description presented in the site about Afghanistan, Afghanistan is a war zone and conflict area and the mission for the international community is mostly noted as a conflict resolution mission. Despite the fact that there is conflict in Afghanistan, we have many other facets and aspects of life in Afghanistan that are less noted or sometimes not even noted. To be realistic, the story of war is not the only thing happening in this country and therefore it is not a fair introduction of Afghanistan as a country which is grappling with war and at the same time pacing towards peace, tolerance and advancement. We have had many instances of improvement, peace advocacy, and the most important indicator of change; change in the way people think in the ten years of struggling for peace, reconstruction and revival of hopes and aspiration for people. These are also among what has happened in Afghanistan since the fall of the Taliban.</p>
<p>During the training programme you will be asked to commit yourself to follow-up networking and development activities? Please describe 3 ways peace could be developed in your country that you can influence.</p>	<p>Once I am back from the program, I will make a network of youth to work on peace-building and conflict resolution. I will also talk to the school to hold sessions in which people can come together and talk and discuss peace-building and practical ways to make the peace-building happen in the community. Since I am the Director of Marefat English Language Program, I will hold sessions in the centre and will gather teachers and students to debate and discuss the issue of peace-building. I will talk to the students and to my fellows and classmates about it and will encourage them to participate in peace building activities.</p>
<p>Please visit UNESCO's youth peace ambassador site. Could you comment on how this network could be helpful in your country?</p>	<p>UNESCO peace Ambassadors network is a worldwide network of youth who are committed to volunteer for peace building and conflict resolution in different countries. As far as I know, the network is holding workshops and projects in Afghanistan in order to bring youth together and that happens really helpful for my country. I attended one of the workshops held in Kabul, some two years ago and I learned a lot from the workshop about making networks in smaller scales and running activities for peace building with our friends and within our families.</p>
<p>Every four years the Olympic Truce offers a chance for a visible global peace. How does this affect your country?</p>	<p>I think my country also has a lot to share in peace-building and collaborations made for bringing peace and stability. It will help advocate peace in my community and provide an opportunity for youth to learn about peace and peace-building.</p>
<p>The Olympic Youth Peace Ambassadors would commit themselves to</p>	<p>I am interested in advocating peace in my country and finding youths who will be committed in working for peace-building.</p>

working to develop the Truce for the next Olympics. Would you be able to offer your time and experience to make this happen in your country for the 2016 Olympics?	
Do you have any special interest in a particular area of peace development?	Since I live in a country torn apart by war and conflicts, I am interested in learning about conflict resolution and peace-building in a post conflict society.
Which organisations in your country could be useful to build a peace coalition working on the Olympic Truce?	Since the fall of the Taliban, there have been many organizations and institutions in Afghanistan founded to work on peace-building, civil values and human rights. Among those, Marefat High School has been committed in working on peace building and in institutionalization of civil values since its initiation. The school has taken many measures to advocate peace in the community.
Do you have any comments or thoughts you wish to share with us on the issue of peace-building and the Olympics?	I think the Olympics is an initiative for bringing people together from different backgrounds so we come to think of the similarities we share and forget about the differences that separate us. The peace-building program is another initiative for bringing people together from different backgrounds and seeking for ways to end wars and conflicts. Through this opportunity I will be able to meet people with different views and experiences and backgrounds than mine, and I will have a chance to interact and learn from them and share with them my views, experiences and thoughts. I will be able to talk to them about my country and what the new generation of my country has to share in this process of collaborating for making a better world.
Do you have any comments or thoughts you wish to share with us on the issue of conflict and violence in your country?	Although there is conflict in Afghanistan we as the new generation have the responsibility to seek ways for resolving all these and substitute them with peace and tolerance. The conflicts are the result of thinking about the differences rather than the similarities we have in common. We can talk and struggle for reaching a common understanding and think of making collaborations with each other so we can provide grounds for our dreams to be realized.

However, at community level where people suffer the most from the impact of conflicts, disasters and other social vices, there needs to be peace-related activities and projects. I intend along with youth in the Niger-Delta region to commence a reawakening through apprenticeship and vocation activities to improve employability and youth engagement. We often ask people especially youth to desist from violence without providing alternative mediums the can re-channel their excess energies to.

	<p>2. Re-orientation and community-based role models: communities can be driven towards peace if individuals therein understand and know how to work through differences of opinion in a peaceful manner towards a productive goal. Hence the reason for this approach. Having people within the same communities or neighbouring communities work together on specific projects will help promote integration and community cohesion. For example the methods of apprenticeship and vocational activities will be to form multi-ethnic group of people/youths to work together on capacity building or community development projects. During the process, they learn to work together, but beyond this, they also learn to understand one another more. Like most other conflict-ridden places in the world, conflict issues have fundamental roots in stereotypes and myths. If no platform is created to bring people together, these stereotypes persist. Most places where there are major conflicts in Nigeria are micro communities, major urban areas do have conflicts except political unrest which is fuelled by government or through political puppeteering.</p> <p>3. Creative problem-solving strategies: this will involve delivering safety education in the community, schools, and religious institutions. Safety and sense of safety is a common factor to everyone in Nigeria irrespective of tribe, ethnic, vocation, or orientation. This project or activities will either run as a stationed training school or mobile educational programme (I'm involved in a similar project through west midlands fire service in the UK). This will be delivered to people, teaching them basic life support skills, preventive measures and the basic concept of being safe. This will create and increase their sense of membership in their group, culture and community. It will also enhance their ability to recognise their individual contributions and that of others to the creation and sustainability of peace in their community. When discussing violence and conflict in the developing world, one should be careful with one's concepts since some of the security-related concepts that are applicable in the discussion about European security might lose their Normative relevance when applied to a third world context. When talking about stability as something opposite to war and the collapse of the state, one should bear in mind that many non-democratic states might be very violent in their normal form - they might be more failed as states than they would be if they were unstable. Violence can be part of order, rather than disorder; it can be part of continuance rather than part of change.</p> <p>Yet of course, good governance and the production of public good requires order and stability, but the important thing is that this order and stability cannot be just any kind of order to be better than disorder and instability. Similarly, the western idea that public goods need to be produced primarily by the state and not some other group or institution is not to be taken for granted. And I think the time has come for us to consider, in the light of our experiences ... whether the methods which we have applied so far are adequate.” Nelson Mandela The question is no longer between violence and non-violence; it is between non-violence and non-existence.” Martin Luther King Jr. The demand for capable and competent leaders who are committed to the values of Islam and the restoration of national state has been discussed in the past article.¹ Yet, Somalia remains to be a country that inspires images of violence, chaos, disorder and abject poverty. For the past two decades, various clans and sub clans have been dead locked in a violent struggle for power and dominance. The lethal use of force has become the culture in resolving disputes between rival clans, groups and governments. Now recent events, such as the Ethiopian intervention and the alleged Al-Qaeda presence have further exacerbated the conflict and fueled the already growing volatile and dismal state of Somalia. This infatuation of violence has been the root cause of the total collapse of all Somali institutions and the human suffering. In addition, any peace talks on the nation's agenda have been delayed due to the consequent of all this violence. In order to conceptualize this violent reality, it is crucial for the young generation of</p>

Somalis to learn the historical conflict, and understand more deeply the crippling damage it has brought to a nation. Somalia can be viewed in terms of identity socio-politics, where clan loyalty plays a key determinate in starting or fueling the violence. However, clan identity is not the basis of the ensuing violence but rather their deliberate manipulation creates and exacerbates divisions. Also, the colonial rule in Somalia created a system of unequal advantage among the various clans in the region. This inequality laid the foundation for potential conflict and tension along the clan structures. Subsequent decades later, Somalia obtained its independence in July 1st 1960. During that year, British Somaliland (north) and the Italian Somaliland (south) were unified to give birth to the Republic of Somalia. While the newly formed Somali state was in a pre-mature stage of governance it had engaged in a border dispute with Ethiopia and Kenya. Post-independence leaders sought to unite Somalis under the banner of 'Great Somalia', encompassing the north-eastern region of Kenya, French Somaliland (now Djibouti), and the Ogaden region of Ethiopia. This national goal, however, divulged Somalia to be in constant conflict with its neighbours.

Furthermore, in early 1990's, as the situation escalated to a boiling point, anti government groups and the clan based factions engaged in a bloody battle against Barre's regime. Fighting between the opposition and the government continued until the collapse of the state in 1991, leaving thousands of people dead. After the defeat of Barre's regime and the absence of an immediate agreement on a new government, a fierce struggle for power began within the alliance opposition groups. This particular conflict resurfaced strong clan zeal and deep rooted grievances. The fighting continued between SPM and USC, and later within USC factions in Mogadishu. These inter-clan battles further contributed to the statistical loss of life and casualty in Somalia; ranging from tens of thousands of fatalities and about a million refugees in and outside the country. The descent into chaos and lawlessness in Somalia has brought a wave of dramatic events in the 1990's. Relative peaceful administrations were established in Puntland and Somaliland while bloody conflicts continued in Southern Somalia. This unfortunate situation has brought extreme measures of poverty and shortage of food that resulted in a devastating famine. In response to the humanitarian crisis, the U.N Security Council authorized the deployment of troops in 1992. The principle objective was to 'Restore Hope' and deliver food and aid safely to the neediest areas in southern Somalia. When viewing the development of Somalia, in relation to the country's history of ongoing conflict, it therefore leaves us to consider the perspective that the use of violence is the single factor obstacle to any socio-political and economic progress in Somalia. It is evident that Somalis have failed in their history to resort to peaceful conflict resolutions and opted for violent means. Today, the Transitional Federal Government (TFG) backed by Ethiopia and the Alliance opposition backed by Eritrea are all furthering this ongoing violence. None of them have demonstrated a non-violent

	<p>approach or policy in restoring hope and peace in the country. In the past half decade, oppressive violence and reactive violence has been systematically perpetuated with no regard for the potential devastating consequence. To reverse this enormous catastrophe, it is crucial for Somalis to understand that any future solution to the Somali crises will have to be in the form of non-violent means. The civil society organizations in Somalia give some hope because of their determined commitment to the values of peace and development. It is imperative that such organizations are formed and supported and the use of violence to solve Somali affairs denounced, once and for all, by all Somalis who are sincere about peace in Somalia.</p>

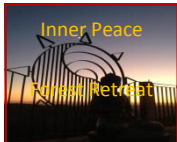
