

ETGG2030 national chapters – Practicalities





- Cooperation with consortium partners in 6 participating countries
- Remuneration is symbolic (ca. 1,000 EUR); contract by HNEE
- Report volume (national chapters): up to 10 pages for smaller countries, up to 15 pages for larger countries (Word document)
- plus annexes (information sources, lists of stakeholders, partners, etc.); format to be determined
- ➤ **Timeframe**: Contract by April 12 Draft report by mid-June Final report by early July Our report to EASME due in August 2021

National sustainable tourism hubs

- Networks with government institutions, BSOs (tourism associations, chambers of commerce), selected individual businesses, training institutions, certification schemes, NGOs, etc. ...
